Dear Friends,

It has been a while since I read a book written by Henri J. M. Nouwen and I am astonished all over again at the wisdom of his writings. This May, I share with you an excerpt from his book "With Open Hands" which is about prayer. This is from pp 83-85:

When God asked Adam, "Where are you?" Adam answered, "I was hiding" (Genesis 3:9-10). He confessed his true condition. The confession opened him to God. When we pray, we come out of our shelters and not only see our own nakedness but also see that there is no enemy to hide from, only a friend who likes nothing better than to clothe us with a new coat. Certainly praying takes some admissions. It requires the humble recognition of our condition as broken human beings. However, prayer does not lead us to shame, guilt, or despair, but rather to the joyful discovery that we are only human and that God is truly God.

If we cling tightly to our own weakness, our faults, shortcomings and our twisted past, to all the events, facts and situations which we would prefer to cut out of our own history, we are only hiding behind a hedge through which everyone can see. What we have done is to narrow our world to a small hiding place where we try to conceal ourselves, suspecting rather pitifully that everyone has seen us all along.

Praying means giving up a false security, no longer looking for arguments which will protect you if you get pushed into a corner, no longer setting your hope on a couple lighter moments which your life might still offer. To pray INSIDE THIS ISSUE:

One of the projects, Justice Restored 3.0, celebrates the writing and drawings of young people from inside and outside the Chester County Juvenile Detention Center. On every page of the book, found on Amazon, their fears and hopes shout out in strong language and vibrant illustrations.

Through a collaborative two phase project this book came into being. The writing came first in response to a simple prompt: Who am I? Where do I come from? A powerful catalyst resulting in vibrant prose, poems, letters and essays which were then given to peers who used their artistic skills to develop accompanying illustrations. Each of these partnerships delivers a strong impact on the page.

Social injustice and personal struggles are common themes. In a series of letters a direct appeal to parents, schools, and members of the community is made. Page after page of Justice Restored 3.0 astonishes, provokes, and powerfully moves. Be prepared, this little book will take your breath away!
