THE SERMON BY THE REV. DANIEL HINKLE

THE NICENE CREED

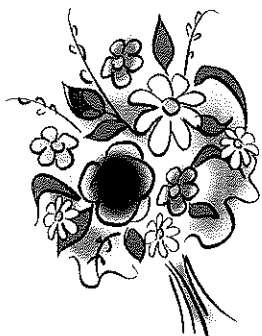
