





## **THE SERMON BY THE REV. SHERRY DEETS**

### **THE CREED**

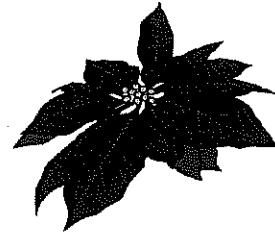
